Please Note: This is the second of three consultations that VeriSign is holding to solicit participation in this research and development effort specified in its Registry Agreement. The first meeting was held in Washington, DC on August 15 and focused on input from *business, intellectual property and law enforcement interests*. The November 15 consultation is designed to reach out to the *international* community. As a result of increased concern by some about travel and security, and our belief that many of the people who would have wanted to attend a consultation overseas will already be in Marina del Rey, we have decided against holding a separate meeting in Europe, Asia or elsewhere. We are instead scheduling the international consultation to begin immediately after the close of the November ICANN meeting in Marina del Rey.

The third consultation will focus on input from *civil liberties* groups and be hosted by the Center for Democracy and Technology in Washington, DC on November 19. More details will be forthcoming shortly. All of these consultations are open to anyone who would like to participate.

In addition to these formal consultations, VeriSign has held, or plans to hold, informal consultations on the margins of key international technical meetings for those attendees, including:

- RIPE - October 3-4, 2001 (DNR Working Group and Database Working Group), Prague
- NANOG - October 23, 2001, Oakland
- ARIN - October 29-31, Miami
- RIPE - January 14-19, 2002, Amsterdam (tentative)
- APRICOT - March 3-7, 2002, Bangkok (tentative)
